The Foundation is based in Abuja, Nigeria with state offices in Taraba and Edo.



He had an illustrious career in the Nigerian Army, retiring as Chief of Army Staff in 1979 before starting a business career. Among the companies he created is the NAL-COMET Group, which is one of Nigeria's most successful indigenous shipping agencies and terminal operators in Nigeria and South Atlantic Petroleum Ltd.- an oil exploration and production company set to become one of the largest indigenous oil producers in Africa.

General TY Danjuma is deeply patriotic and has served in key political positions, including; the Chairman of the Presidential Policy Advisory Committee (1999), the Honourable Minister of Defence (1999-2003), and Chairman of the Presidential Advisory Council (2010).

General TY Danjuma is also a philanthropist with a solid track record of philanthropic giving which culminated in the establishment of the TY Danjuma Foundation.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In 2023, the Foundation expanded its collaborations with organisations in the health and education sectors. This resulted in reaching more individuals in need through medical and surgical interventions, maternal and child health services, provision of clean water, emergency humanitarian aid, and distribution of medicines to combat neglected tropical diseases in affected areas. Additionally, investments were made in teacher training, school feeding and infrastructural improvements to enhance access to quality education.

Despite the economic challenges, the Foundation and its partners remained committed to their mission of providing quality healthcare and education to underserved communities. Through strategic grantmaking and partnerships, the Foundation executed forty projects across seventeen states and the Federal Capital Territory, impacting over one hundred and twenty one thousand people directly.

Feedback from beneficiaries and partners indicated the significant and transformative impact of the Foundation's initiatives in 2023. The Foundation is grateful to all stakeholders for their support. We remain dedicated to advancing the well-being of communities across Nigeria.









Geographical Spread of 2023 Projects

Overview of 2023 Health Programme

In 2023, the Foundation invested in health grantees to enhance access to quality and affordable healthcare in seven states.

The funding for health projects focused on reducing preventable blindness, improving maternal & child health, providing free medical services in rural communities, combating neglected tropical diseases (NTDs), and providing support to Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs).

Geographical Spread of 2023 Health Projects


The map below shows the geographical spread of health projects across Nigeria in 2023.






Maternal & Child Health

Grants awarded in the 2023 cycle for the "Healthy Mother Healthy Child" programme was aimed at creating access to quality and affordable healthcare services for women and children, especially in rural areas. The grants strengthened healthcare systems through training of health workers and Traditional Birth Attendants (TBAs) to provide improved services, promote the uptake of antenatal care services, fight malnutrition among children under five years and prevent mother-to-child transmission of HIV. The grants also supported access to essential medicine for women and children, immunisation, the upgrading of labour wards and educating communities for a change in health-seeking behaviour. The overall goal of the "Healthy Mother Healthy Child" programme is to contribute to reversing the high rate of maternal and under-five mortality in Nigeria which stands at 512 deaths per 100,000 live births, and 132 deaths per 1000 live births respectively (UNICEF, 2023).

Goodwill Medical Centre (GMC) in Enugu

In November 2023, the Foundation inaugurated the GMC located in Umuchigbo, Iji Nike in Abakpa Community in Enugu State. The hospital is a state-of-the-art facility that provides quality and affordable healthcare for low-income and underprivileged families in Enugu state. The GMC offers a range of services, including maternal and child health, general primary healthcare, laboratory, eye health, communicable disease prevention and treatment, general surgical, and accident emergency services.

The target population of the GMC is the rural poor and the vulnerable groups, such as women, children, the elderly, and the disabled. The goal of the GMC is to improve access to quality healthcare and to reduce the burden of disease and mortality in the community.






Merry Ehanire Mother and Child Hospital in Benin City

The Merry Ehanire hospital was commissioned in December 2023 as a beacon of hope that provides high-quality and cost-effective healthcare services for mothers and children in Edo state and beyond. The hospital is equipped with modern facilities and equipment, and has a team of qualified and experienced medical staff.

The primary target population of the hospital is the mothers and children, who lack access to quality healthcare. The goal of the hospital is to reduce maternal and child mortality, morbidity and to support healthy and productive lives.



The medical devices at the Goodwill Medical Centre, the Merry Ehanire hospital and the Foundation's Medical Centre in Takum are in sync with the Foundation's mission to improve access to quality healthcare for Nigerians.





Preventable Blindness

According to the International Agency for the Prevention of Blindness, 99% of blindness can be prevented or treated (IAPB, 2023). The Foundation is combining information, knowledge, and enhanced access to eye care services for the vulnerable people in the rural areas.

In 2023, the Foundation supported two projects to address avoidable blindness. The projects enhanced the capacity of community health workers in primary eye care and trained teachers in primary and secondary schools to identify simple eye conditions.

Neglected Tropical Diseases (NTDs)

Nigeria is battling 15 of the 20 neglected tropical diseases listed by the United Nations (UN, 2023). Awareness creation and information sharing are ways to battle NTDs, however, a widely accepted way of combatting these disease is through mass drug administration. The Chairman Emeritus led the fight against NTDs from 1996 till 2009 when he set up the Foundation to continue investing in the control and elimination of NTDs in the state.

In 2023, after sustained interventions to curb the spread of NTDs in Taraba State in partnership with Mission To Save The Helpless (MITOSATH), the Foundation funded an epidemiological and an entomological assessment to generate evidence on the level of elimination of NTDs in Taraba State. Preliminary results from the epidemiogical assessments indicates that there has been significant progress in the control and elimination of onchocerciasis in Taraba State.






Free Medical and Surgical Outreaches

Medical missions are designed to address pressing health challenges for rural dwellers. While only complimentary of the normal health services, medical outreaches are now a crucial component in the effort to bring healthcare closer to the poor.

In 2023, the Foundation invested in free medical and surgical outreaches for people with various medical conditions and those requiring surgeries.






Humanitarian Response

The daily burden – emotional, physical, and those of needs, for the Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) is almost unimaginable. Food, shelter, clothing, and healthcare available to them are usually too few and far between. The Foundation continues to support internally displaced persons with basic needs of food and nutritional supplements for children, as well as maternal and child healthcare services in various IDP camps and settlements.




Overview of 2023 Education Programme

The Foundation's investment in education in 2023 focused on improving the capacity of teachers to transfer knowledge and contribute to improving the quality of education in target states. The training also focused on improving the capacity of school supervisors to strengthen the school management system and to provide the needed support to teachers.

The map below shows the geographical spread of education projects across Nigeria in 2023.






Improving Teaching Quality

The overall goal of the intervention is to contribute to efforts aimed at improving the quality of universal basic and secondary education in project locations. To achieve this, funding was targeted towards building the capacity of teachers in various themes such as project-based learning, building trauma-sensitive classrooms, pedagogy, use of improvised teaching materials, classroom management skills, use of ICT in teaching and learning, preparation and delivery of lesson plans among other relevant topics.

Support was also provided to build the capacity of managers of education in project locations on effective school supervision, constructive feedback mechanisms, supportive supervision, and support was given to facilitate the managers to carry out their statutory responsibilities of school supervision. They were also mobilized to step down the training to teachers under their supervision.

Additionally, funding was also directed at the provision of instructional materials, and infrastructural support to underserved and needy schools to improve the learning and teaching environment and ensure community ownership of public schools.


